Grandma Lewis Burned to Death. Grandma Lewis, aged 83 years, was burned to death Monday evening, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Baker, at Thatcher. Grandma Lewis who had been quite feeble for some time, was along in the home, and it is believed that while sitting in front of the open fire place, that her loose robe caught fire and she did not realize this until the robe was in flames. Her screams were heard by her son-in-law, Winford Moody, who lives nearby, and he rushed to her assistance and extinguished the flames, but too late to save her, as she had inhaled the flames and smoke, and she died in half an hour. Her face and upper part of her body were badly burned. Funeral services were held in Thatcher Church, Tuesday afternoon. The singing was furnished by members of the choir, led by Prof. H.L. Payne. The speakers were: Mrs. Selina Phillips, John F. Nash, Thomas Kimball and President Andrew Kimball. The remains were interred in Thatcher Cemetery.
