Mrs. I. P. Robinson. On Sunday last one of the pioneer women of this valley, Mrs. I. P. Robinson of Thatcher, passed to the unknown beyond after an illness of several months. The deceased lady had suffered terribly from cancers before death and had gone under operations by both eastern and western surgeons, but to no avail. The funeral was held in the Thatcher meeting house last Tuesday and was largely attended by friends and relatives from all parts of the county. The body was laid to rest in the Thatcher cemetery. Mrs. Robinson came to the valley from Utah with her family in the early eighties and first settled at Pima, afterwards removing to Thatcher, where she has since resided. Mrs. Robinson was a lady of character, always on hand to lend a helping hand to the needy, of a kind and gentle disposition, and held in the highest esteem by all. She was the mother of 13 children, 9 of whom, together with her husband, she leaves to mourn her death.
